Proficient already in the Minnesota Work, the Emulation Work is our additional area of study and practice, and a fascinating morality play for visitors. In addition to its ritual, our lodge seeks to capture and practice many of the foundational elements of British lodges, such as festive boards, philosophical education, dress, programs and charities. By so doing, we will provide an environment that is distinguished and warm, social and philosophical, exclusive and inviting.

Sir Winston Churchill Lodge #351 meets once a month, on the 3rd or 4th Friday. We usually meet at members' homes to foster the sense of warmth and camaraderie we seek.
